Collect your plastic lids at home, and drop them into the labeled collection

boxes. Most of the plastic caps and lids that regularly collect in your kitchen are among those that are accepted, but lids from takeout beverage cups are not accepted (keep carrying your water bottles and reusable mugs!). Do make sure you include only 100% plastic lids, with no metal or cardboard, please. Use
